

COVID Protocol

Symptoms to report to the school include:

Cough

Fever

Muscle aches

Nausea and vomiting

Runny nose

Diarrhea

Shortness of breath

Severe stomach pain

Red eyes

Skin rash

Redness or swelling of lips, tongue, hands or feet

Verbal or nonverbal declaration that food is not smelling or tasting the same i.e. refusing to eat favorite food.

1. If a student is found to have any of the above symptoms, the child will be sent home with the recommendations to be tested for COVID-19 or stay home until he/she has met all criteria listed:

10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared 3 days with no fever w/o use of Tylenol or Motrin Symptoms have improved

2. What happens if a student/teacher test positive for COVID19?

The affected class will return to online learning for at least 14 days from the last contact with the sick individual. Education will be provided in the online format. All exposed individuals should monitor for symptoms. Please:

Note the onset of any new symptoms Monitor temperature twice a day Keep a daily record of fever, cough, and additional respiratory symptoms Seek further evaluation from a healthcare provider

3. Please know that each situation will be looked at on a case by case basis based on new guidelines that are released from the CDC, Texas Department of Health, and the Texas Education Agency.

In addition to meeting the above criteria listed above, all COVID positive individuals will need a medical clearance for return. This clearance is usually provided by your primary care provider and should state that criteria for clearance has been met.
